

Transition and New Faces



Greater Hazleton continues to be a top location in the United States for companies looking to grow their business. Many nationally- and internationally-recognized companies choose to locate here because they realize the area's position within a day's drive of one-third of the U.S. population and half of Canada will help them get their products to markets and consumers quickly and efficiently. over the past several years, with many new companies setting up shop and others expanding their operations.

CAN DO, the region's premier economic development organization, welcomed several new companies to its industrial parks in the last few years. That activity alone resulted in new projects operating in over 1.4 million square feet of building space that created 520 new jobs in the area with a capital investment of nearly \$200 million.

By locating in Greater Hazleton, Little Leaf Farms has been able to significantly increase its growth along the east coast.

Arcadia officials chose Greater Hazleton because they feel it is a growing market in Pennsylvania and a natural consolidation distribution location. CEO Chris Hughes said this facility will play an important role in allowing Arcadia to serve food manufacturing and end user demand more quickly and efficiently. "The Arcadia Team is very excited to announce our third cold storage location in Greater Hazleton as part of our larger national greenfield platform strategy. We anticipate leveraging this strategic site to support our customers' need for a quality Northeastern U.S. regional distribution hub that offers a variety of value-added service offerings in this 30,000 pallet facility. We are grateful to CAN DO for their support in helping to bring this project to fruition and, most importantly, for helping to bring new, quality jobs to Hazleton and the surrounding area," he said.

German-owned nutraceutical manufacturer Amapharm LLC started production in 2023 in a 43,500 square-foot building CAN DO constructed for the company in the CAN DO Corporate Center in Drums. When it reaches its operational peak, Amapharm expects to create nearly 100 new jobs for the area. Although the company distributes its products in more than 75 countries, this new facility is Amapharm's first U.S. site.

Amapharm chose to locate in the CAN DO Corporate Center because it's recognized as a world-class business park that offered the company state-of-theart infrastructure and a vibrant business ecosystem. Amapharm's decision to choose Drums as their U.S. base signifies their confidence in the local community.

Corrugated supplies manufacturer Ruskin Packaging began leasing 50,000 square feet of space in a building along Commerce Drive in Humboldt Industrial Park in the summer of 2022. Within less than a year, the company expanded to occupy 151,000 square feet of the 440,000 square-foot building it shares with Corrugated Supply Company. Ruskin Packaging expects to hire approximately 100 people and invest roughly \$1.5 million into the facility.

David Ortiz, Ruskin's VP of Operations, said opening a facility in Greater Hazleton is part of the company's strategic focus to expand its footprint throughout the country and grow its existing capabilities and customer base in the Hazleton, Pittsburgh and Philadelphia markets. "The Rusken Packaging footprint continues to expand and we now have the ability to support both new and existing customers with great quality packaging in the Northeast part of the U.S.," he said.

Little Leaf Farms, the number one brand of packaged lettuce sustainably grown through controlled environment agriculture (CEA) in the country, opened its second stateof-the-art greenhouse in the McAdoo Industrial Park in 2023. The company owns 180 acres in McAdoo and has rapidly grown to be the largest producer of indoor-grown leafy greens in the state. The company opened its first 10acre greenhouse in McAdoo in July of 2022 and, with the addition of the new greenhouse, now employs more than 170 people. Little Leaf plans to eventually add four more greenhouses to the site.

Paul Sellew, Founder and CEO of Little Leaf Farms, said, "We continue to build on our ambitious plans for growth and our expansion in Pennsylvania is a testament to how we've been able to continuously scale our efficient production and operations. Pennsylvania has been an excellent partner in bringing our vision for expansion to life. With its ideal location on the East Coast, we've been able to grow significantly to the Southeast and are now looking forward to even more growth in the Midwest to bring our delicious and fresh greens to more consumers, all still within 24 hours of harvesting for ultimate freshness."

Greater Hazleton's access to markets brings growth with several companies expanding their facilities



EAM-Mosca's expansion includes a first-of-its-kind customer showroom that will bring clients from Latin America, Mexico, the United States and Canada to Greater Hazleton.

Once companies set up operations in Greater Hazleton, they find out just how quickly their business can thrive because of the region's access to key transportation routes and a dedicated workforce. This success leads to companies not only staying in the area but choosing to expand their facilities.

Several companies have executed major expansions over the last few years.

EAM-Mosca Corp., an international manufacturer of innovative, high-quality, fully automated end-of-line packaging machinery systems and plastic packaging consumables, is finalzing a \$9 million complete renovation of its new facility at 525 Jaycee Drive in the Valmont Industrial Park in West Hazleton, which is adjacent to its existing headquarters at 675 Jaycee Drive.

The reconstruction of the facility is scheduled to be completed with occupancy by February 2024. The new facility is part of a larger \$20.6 million strategic initiative to expand the company's operational footprint within Pennsylvania. EAM-Mosca, which is one of Pennsylvania's premier innovation-focused manufacturers, now operates out of a 283,000 square-foot, two-building campus set on 50 acres in Valmont. Its Greater Hazleton location serves as its Headquarters for the Americas and will assist clients across Latin America, Mexico, the United States and Canada. The building will also include a first-of-its-kind customer showroom, making the Greater Hazleton facility a more convenient midpoint for clients throughout the

Americas.

Jan Wessel, Executive Vice President & Chief Financial Officer at EAM-Mosca, said, "This is the largest step taken in our growth trajectory, and we see it not as an isolated investment but as the continued evolution of our company. This is not just a one-time investment or expansion. Since 2017, we've already invested over \$20 million in our productive operations. This is just continuing our market success to reinvest and grow our business, bringing our total of recent investments in Pennsylvania to nearly \$50 million in less than 10 years."

John D'Ottavio, Executive Vice President & Chief Operating Officer at EAM-Mosca, said the company is also committed to developing the local workforce, which benefits Greater Hazleton residents. "Part of that over \$20 million investment is the realization that we need to develop training programs to build the next generation of folks that will be able to both design and produce our machines and the strapping products. That's an investment in the community realizing that developing the workforce is critical to our future."

UK-based furniture manufacturer Muzo also expanded its operations in the Valmont Industrial Park. In addition to its main location at 360 Kiwanis Boulevard, which serves as the company's international headquarters, it's also leasing a multi-tenant building from CAN DO and now has a total of 60,000 square feet of space between the two facilities. Muzo, which makes furniture for flexible

classroom learning and office solutions, first located its U.S. operations in the CAN DO Corporate Center in 2010 before expanding to Valmont in 2020.

Darren Buttle, Muzo's founder and CEO, said that he fell in love with Northeast Pennsylvania because it reminded him of his home in Yorkshire in the UK. When he had the chance to enter into a flexible lease agreement and move his operations to the Valmont Industrial Park. he knew he was making the right decision for the company's future. "We are a growing business. We've established ourselves in this region and we like the people and we like the area," he said. "Transportation routes are great here and our east coast business is very, very strong. We sell worldwide and will be exporting from here to a number

of regions around the world. I believe our presence will attract business visitors from across the USA and from all over the world."

PFNonwovens also has its North American headquarters in Greater Hazleton and completed work on a \$75 million expansion to the facility in 2022. The company's 150,000 square-foot expansion included installing a new line in half of the space, while reserving the remaining 75,000 square feet for growth. PFN's facility now totals 2023. The project was a joint effort between CAN DO and the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation.

The Route 424 expansion project not only relieves traffic on Route 924, which was previously the main access point to Humboldt, but also makes the park more accessible for emergency responders and allows trucks to easily access the industrial park from the on and off ramps of Interstate 81 at the Greater Hazleton Chamber of Commerce Beltway exit.




CAN DO and PennDOT collaborated on an extension project of Route 424 that alleviated traffic congestion and created greater access to Humboldt Industrial Park.

800,000 square feet and employs 370 people. The expansion allows the company to make more hygiene products for the North American market and increase production of its medical fabrics.

PFN CEO Cedric Ballay said, "This new line is key to our continued growth trajectory and will continue writing our great success story here in Hazleton and around the world. These fabrics continue to improve people's life on a daily basis, and help bring a more sustainable world."

All of the business expansion and new activity in the area, particularly in Humboldt Industrial Park, resulted in a road expansion as well. After several years of construction, an expansion project to Route 424 entering into Humboldt Industrial Park was finally completed at the end of

Greater Hazleton Development

Business is booming in Greater Hazleton! Eight developers have completed or are working on constructing a total of more than 30 buildings over 25.8 million square feet of space across the area that would be ideal for manufacturing and distribution companies.

Blue Creek Investments/Blue Rock Construction

Blue Rock Construction and its development arm Blue Creek Investments completed construction on a 1.2 million square-foot manufacturing facility in 2022 that is the new home of Hillwood Properties/Samsung's Hazleton operations. The site is located along Route 309 behind Hazleton's Birch Knoll neighborhood on 100 acres of reclaimed mine land that was previously vacant for decades. Blue Creek Investments is now working on the second phase of the project, which is referred to as Hazleton Logistics South. This second building will be approximately 500,000 square feet and is expected to open in 2024. Samsung's facility created approximately 400 jobs and it's anticipated this second building will introduce as many as 300 new jobs to the area.

NorthPoint Development

NorthPoint Development has plans to build six speculative buildings totaling more than 5.3 million square feet on the south side of Route 424 (the Arthur Gardner Beltway) between Route 93 and Route 309 in Hazleton and Hazle Township. The first building in the project – a 1.054 million square-foot facility – is expected to open in mid 2024 and create 352 permanent jobs. When the remaining buildings are added over the next few years, it's anticipated the entire project could create 1,750 new jobs.

former mine land near Route 309 and Buttonwood Street and is planning to develop five buildings totaling 5.5 million square feet. The buildings will be ideal for wholesale, warehousing and manufacturing companies. Construction is underway on the first two buildings, a 1.4 million square-foot facility and another 550,000 square-foot building. The five-building project is expected to result in 1,100 construction jobs and between 4,000 and 6,000 employees.

Mericle Commercial Real Estate

Mericle Commercial Real Estate began work in 2023 to develop its CrossRoads East Business Park on 1,100 acres of land in Hazle Township near Interstate 81 and Routes 924, 309 and 424. Mericle will build the park in four phases and expects to ultimately develop approximately 37 industrial and flex buildings in a variety of sizes. Mericle anticipates a mix of manufacturing, distribution and light industrial tenants will move into the speculative buildings it constructs in the park.

The first phase of the park's construction will result in the creation of nine buildings totaling 1.75 million square feet that range in size from 37,000 to 45,000 square feet. It's anticipated that this first phase alone will result in the creation of hundreds of jobs.

More than 20,000 people work in the buildings Mericle has developed in business parks throughout Northeastern Pennsylvania. In Greater Hazleton, Mericle has developed 18 buildings totaling more than 6.5 million square feet. Sixteen are in Humboldt Industrial Park and two are in Valmont Industrial Park. The tenants in these buildings employ an estimated 4,500 people.

BlueCup Ventures Hazleton I LLC

BlueCup Ventures Hazleton plans to construct three or four buildings along both sides of Route 309 south of

Mericle's project between Beaver Brook and Hazle Village. The buildings, which will total approximately 4 million square feet, will be ideal for bulk distribution companies. Once they are completed and operational after the first quarter of 2024, the new facilities could be the home of 1,600 new jobs.

One Trinity Real Estate

One Trinity Real Estate has plans to construct a 600,000 square-foot building for light manufacturing on land behind the Valmont Plaza in West Hazleton. The firm also already renovated an 85,000 square-foot vacant storefront in the complex. Its additional plans for the area include constructing a 5,000 square-foot building near Big Lots in the plaza for a bank or fast food restaurant and developing more than 1.5 acres near Harbor Freight. One Trinity Real Estate has five other spaces in the plaza that are available for development and range in size from 2,000 square feet to 4,000 square feet.

Brewster Land Co. Inc.

Brewster Land Co. is planning to construct four buildings totaling 3 million square feet of space in Kline Township near the McAdoo exit of Interstate 81. The speculative buildings will be ideal for distribution companies.

Crossroads XOXO/Crossroads XOX

Crossroads XOXO and Crossroads XOX plan to develop four buildings totaling more than 4 million square feet on land near Tomhicken Road. Two of the buildings will be located in Sugarloaf Township and will be 1.056 million square feet and 1.275 million square feet. The facility in Hazle Township is expected to be 1.275 million square feet. The final building will be constructed in parts of West Hazleton and Sugarloaf Township and will be 254,000 square feet.

Greater Hazleton's access to transportation routes a major reason for the area's economic growth

In Greater Hazleton, it's easy to move both individuals and goods by plane, train and automobile which is another reason companies flock to the region to do business.

Hazleton Public Transit (HPT), which operates out of Church Street Station at 126 Mine Street in downtown Hazleton,

HPT's Church Street Station operations center, which includes administrative offices, provides residents of Greater Hazleton with a central hub for local, regional and long-distance bus transportation. HPT passengers can board HPT buses, purchase bus passes, and obtain customer support services at the facility.

offers both weekday and weekend bus service on 12 different routes, with stops that include Hazleton Heights, McAdoo, Kelayres, Beaver Meadows, Weatherly, Freeland, parts of Diamond Avenue, West Hazleton, Church Hill Mall, Laurel Mall, Walmart, Penn State Hazleton, Humboldt Industrial Park and selected locations in Mountaintop and Wilkes-Barre.

In late 2023, HPT

opened a \$26 million bus storage and maintenance facility on the Old Airport Road in Hazle Township. The 44,000-square-foot facility houses its 12 full-size buses, three paratransit vans and service vehicles. It includes a bus washing station, work bays to perform maintenance, and many amenities for the bus drivers, including locker rooms, a kitchen area and a lounge. There is also a compressed natural gas fueling station on-site for HPT's buses. This new facility allows HPT to handle all of its bus functions in one central location.

With Greater Hazleton being home to some of the most wellknown national and

international companies, convenient access to corporate air travel is important. The Hazleton Municipal Airport serves as a hub for travelers who need to access the entire Northeast section of the country. Additionally, Global Air offers world-wide charter service from the airport.

The airport recently expanded its runway and can handle a variety of aircraft sizes including

single-engine airplanes, private planes, and large corporate iets. Being able to accommodate business travelers is a boost for both Greater Hazleton's business and industry sector as well as its economy, as these executives spend time in the community and eat and shop at local establishments while they are here. Some of the corporations who routinely use the airport include Niagara, American Eagle, Samsung, Blue Rock developers and Eagle Rock Resort.

Companies continue to choose Greater Hazleton to conduct

business because of the region's access to key transportation routes. With immediate access to six major interstates (I-81, I-80, I-84, I-476, I-380 and I-78), businesses can easily reach the more than 51 million people who live within 200 miles of Northeast Pennsylvania. Greater Hazleton is also within a day's drive of one-third of the U.S. and half of Canada and provides easy access to major metropolitan markets like New York City, Baltimore, Washington, D.C. and Boston. Additionally, companies can reach 80 percent of the U.S. population within two days or less.

This access to major interstates helps Greater Hazleton attract a skilled and reliable labor force from across Northeast PA. The entire region has a civilian labor force of more than 530,000 individuals and there are more than 50,000 students enrolled at more than 20 higher educational institutions in the area. In addition to the interstate highways, access to state routes like Route 309, Route 93 and Route 924, along with the local bus transportation, provide plenty of options for employees to get to and from work.

Businesses also find convenient access to freight rail transportation at all three of CAN DO's industrial parks. Rail service to Humboldt and Valmont Industrial Parks is provided exclusively by Reading Blue Mountain and Northern Railroad. Intermodal transportation and trans-loading services are provided by the Hazleton and Northeast Rail Commerce Center.

The Wilkes-Barre/Scranton International Airport in Avoca is centrally located in the region and provides access to air travel without the hassle of a larger airport. Greater Hazleton entrepreneurs are cooking up success inside the Hazleton Kitchen Incubator. The Kitchen Incubator is located inside the Hayden Family Center for the Arts at the corner of Broad and Laurel Streets in downtown Hazleton.

The program is another entrepreneurial innovation from The Hazleton Innovation Collaborative (THInC). Budding entrepreneurs who want to open a food or beverage business can test out their idea in the Kitchen Incubator and have a low-risk opportunity to start small, test, develop and scale without the cost of equipping and maintaining their own commercially-licensed culinary facility.

One of the Hazleton Kitchen Incubator's many benefits is that it encourages growth in the local food economy by improving access to resources that are traditionally not available for everyone. It also improves food industry workforce training opportunities through hands-on training and access to commercial equipment.

The Hazleton Kitchen Incubator's newest program is the Food and Beverage Startup Lab. This is ideal for those who need help starting a restaurant, brewery, distillery, catering company or other retail food business. baking. The gamble paid off and now she and her husband are the workforce behind 'Little Treats and Cakes by Janna', a bakery that specializes in celebration cakes, wedding cakes, and small, decorative desserts.

When Hazleton native Andrew Baranko and his family wanted to launch a location of their successful deli-style pizza business in their hometown, they found an efficient way to do it using the Hazleton Kitchen Incubator. Baranko and his family began making their own version of the cold, square-cut, deli/ tavern-style pizza that originated in Hazleton and sold it as Baranko's Pizza at the Hunter's Community Market in Nashville and other pop-up locations in the city.

When local family and friends expressed

an interest in trying out their pizza, they decided to open a Hazleton location. Using the Kitchen Incubator helped Baranko expedite the process of starting his business because it offered everything he needed to get started while keeping his start-up costs low.

Hazleton Innovation Collaborative helping entrepeneurs launch successful businesses

Greater Hazleton has always been known as a business and industry hub for large corporations. However, over the past several years, the region is also placing itself at the forefront of entrepreneurial development. This growth in entrepreneurship is largely due to the combined efforts of student career success.

The Hazleton LaunchBox, located at 13 West Broad Street in Downtown Hazleton, is the main hub for THInC's entrepreneurial activity. Whether you are just getting started with an idea, looking to acquire your

nearly 20 organizations who came together to create The Hazleton Innovation Collaborative, or THInC.

THInC began in 2017 after Penn State Hazleton was awarded a \$10,000 grant from the Invent Penn State initiative to establish an entrepreneurial program in Greater Hazleton. PSU Hazleton faculty

and staff worked with CAN BE (CAN DO's entrepreneurial development arm), the Chamber, the Downtown Hazleton Alliance for Progress and other community partners to establish the foundation of the program. Other vital collaborators include Ben Franklin Technology Partners, tecBRIDGE, the Hazleton LaunchBox supported by Pasco L. Schiavo Esq., and the Small Business Development Center at Wilkes University.

Since it was formed, the group of partners have overseen a massive growth of small businesses in the region and THInC has become synonymous as the place entrepreneurs go to start a business. THInC's primary focus is on providing entrepreneurial support to budding small business owners. The collaborative leverages the resources of its partner organizations to nurture the growth of entrepreneurship in Greater Hazleton and foster a culture that results in economic development, job creation, income growth, improved quality of life and

CAN BE helps inspire young entrepreneurs

CAN BE assists young entrepreneurs through its sponsorship of an annual Chamber award and a partnership with tecBRIDGE, a regional technology-based economic development organization.

CAN BE sponsors the Young Entrepreneur of the Year award that's given out at the Chamber's annual Business & Community Awards luncheon. The award's purpose is to promote the development of future business owners and operators in Greater Hazleton and recognizes a recipient's staying power, growth and community contribution. Award nominees must be between the ages of 13 and 35 and either reside in Greater Hazleton and have a for-profit business or attend school in the area.

Recent winners include Paul DeAngelo, Jr, owner of Collaborative Autism Movement; Brian Simon, a graduating senior from Hazleton Area Academy of Sciences who had success in two local competitions for young entrepreneurs; and Omar Alcantara, the owner of

Have a business idea? Figure out how to turn it into a real business using the LaunchBox's Idea TestLab. The TestLab is a "customer discovery" deep-dive designed to help you better understand the customer problem you're trying to solve and how to use your business idea to provide value in a unique way.

After entrepreneurs complete the education program, they continue to receive follow-up assistance and mentoring from CAN BE staff, Penn State Hazleton faculty and community volunteers. Once an entrepreneur is officially ready to start their business, they can receive additional support from CAN BE through the services it offers entrepreneurs at the CAN BE Innovation Center in Valmont Industrial Park.

Workforce development efforts promote careers in the area

CAN DO has placed a strategic focus on working with partner organizations to assist in the overall growth and development of Greater Hazleton's workforce. By joining forces with these organizations, CAN DO looks to improve the flow of information about the existing workforce and career initiatives throughout the area.

Greater Hazleton: affordable and family friendly

Greater Hazleton has a rich history of being an affordable and familyfriendly location to live, work and play. The region features a low cost of living, a variety of housing options and all the benefits of living in a rural community that also has immediate access to several major cities.

People who live and work in the area find that they receive a lot more for their hard-earned money because the cost of living in Greater Hazleton is well below the U.S. national average. Studies show that

The City of Hazleton, which has a population of more than 29,000, serves as the footprint of the region. According to statistics from Best Places, the cost of living in Hazleton is 20 percent lower than the national average. The median home value in Hazleton is just over \$77,000, making it much lower than the national average of \$176,700.

sector continues to grow exponentially, there has been an increasingly greater need for more housing in the region to accommodate the influx of new residents moving to the area to work. With this in mind, housing development activity has been robust in the area. Allen Ridge Associates has plans to construct approximately 328 townhouses, 196 apartment units and 11 single-family homes on 36 acres along North Wilson Street in Hazleton.

The City of Hazleton is planning to use federal funds to develop a street that has been laid out of maps but was never completed (also known as a paper street) called David Avenue in the city's Terrace section. This proposed street would run between Ferrara Avenue and East Broad Street and allow for private development of homes in the back portion of the land and commercial development along the road. City officials said the homes that will be built will be in the \$300,000 price range.

In addition to affordable rental and mortgage payments for homes and apartments, the cost of things like groceries and utilities is 10 percent less than comparable rates across the country. 



The institute features programming designed to meet the needs of individuals, funded by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, U.S. Department of Labor, or Office of Vocational Rehabilitation.

The workforce development program involves communicating with local employers on what education and training they need

their employees to have and then implementing these programs at the college. This is ideal for employees working in healthcare, finance and the trades.

High school students also have several options to begin taking college courses through Lackawanna College's high school program.

The Hazleton Center also serves the community through partnerships with many of Hazleton's local Latino organizations.



Johnson College

Johnson College's Hazleton campus is housed in the CAN DO Training Center, located at 370 Maplewood Drive in the Humboldt Industrial Park in Hazle Township. The campus includes dedicated classrooms and lab spaces for its programs, and a resource center open to all students.

With the introduction of its Hazleton campus, Johnson College is continuing its mission to provide industry-focused, hands-on learning in a supportive environment where students can work with The medical assistant program prepares students to help physicians by performing functions related to the clinical aspects of a medical office and can lead to careers as a clinical medical assistant, medical clerk, patient services representative, medical office assistant, EKG technician, phlebotomy technician, patient care technician or medical office manager.

The computer program prepares students to support computer users by installing, configuring, troubleshooting and managing computers, hardware, wired, and wireless networks and can lead to

industry leaders to prepare for careers across the region. This also marks the college's first satellite campus location.

Johnson College programs are designed to give students the


disciplines. The Hazleton Center opened in the Broad Street **Exchange Building** on September 26, 2000. Prior to the Center opening, LCCC offered college classes in the evening at the Hazleton High

School. In the past 20 years, approximately 8,000 students have passed through the Center. Some arrived directly after graduating from high school while others worked and raised families before entering. For the Fall of 2023, 528 students were currently enrolled in college classes at the Hazleton Center.

Some students attend LCCC for two-year degrees while aiming at higher degrees from other colleges while others pursue certificates in various trades. Most students take basic classes and finish some programs entirely or move to the main campus in Nanticoke to finish studies in scores of other majors that LCCC offers. Hazleton Area School District adds three new schools to meet growing enrollment and specialty programs





The Hazleton Area Arts and Humanities Academy, began inside the high school and now has expanded to its own facility in the CAN DO Corporate Center in Drums.

More than 11,500 elementary, middle and high school students living in Greater Hazleton receive a quality education through the Hazleton Area School District and its 13 facilities.

The district is centered on the city of Hazleton and serves the surrounding municipalities of Freeland, Jeddo, Foster Township, Butler Township, Conyngham, West Hazleton, Hazle Township, Drums, Sugarloaf Township, and Black Creek Township, as well as parts of Schuylkill and Carbon counties.

Hazleton Area operates ten elementary/middle schools: Arthur Street (K-2), Arthur Street Elementary School Annex (PreK-2), Maple Manor Elementary-Middle School (3-8), McAdoo-Kelayres Elementary-Middle School (K-8), Drums Elementary-Middle School (K-8), Freeland Elementary-Middle School (K-8), Heights-Terrace Elementary-Middle School (K-8), Valley Elementary-Middle School (K-8), West Hazleton Elementary-Middle School (K-8) and Hazleton Elementary-Middle School (K-6). Students in ninth through 12th grades receive instruction at Hazleton Area High School, the Hazleton Area Career Center, the Hazleton Area Academy of Sciences and the Hazleton Area Arts and Humanities Academy.

Through a dynamic partnership of educators, learners, and community members, Hazleton Area High School students develop the skills necessary to become life-long learners in a culturally diverse community. They are challenged to develop selfresponsibility and reach their highest potential in a safe and supportive environment using technology in a comprehensive curriculum. Students study a variety of required courses in English, social studies, science, math, world languages and physical education, and have the option to explore numerous different elective courses. They also have the option to take college-credit classes through the Hazleton Area School District's partnership with Penn State Hazleton, Lackawanna College and Luzerne County Community College.

In addition to the high school building, Hazleton Area's main campus on 23rd Street includes the Hazleton Area Career Center. At the Career Center, students receive career preparation in computer systems networking, broadcast communications, health careers, nurse assistant, dental assistant, collision repair technology, automotive technology, diesel technology, construction technology, electrical and industrial technology, HVAC/plumbing, precision machine technology, welding technology, computer-aided drafting (CAD), cosmetology, child care, culinary arts and law enforcement.

The Hazleton Area School District operates two academies in the CAN DO Corporate Center in Drums: one for students who want to focus on courses in science, technology, engineering and math, and another for students interested in arts and humanities courses.

The Hazleton Area Academy of Sciences STEM school prepares students for careers in the science, technology, engineering and math fields. Students also have the opportunity to explore a variety of electives and take college-credit courses at the school through a partnership with Penn State University. These specialty electives and courses include introduction to engineering design processes, principles of engineering, computer robotics, CAD drafting,

Through the Hazleton Area Arts and Humanities Academy, students can join the band or concert choir and also get an introduction to many specialty courses that will guide them in their future careers. These include historical philosophies and mythologies of ancient cultures, vocal studio, instrumental studio, visual arts studio, communication arts studio, drama studio, dance studio, computer

The Hazleton Area Cyber Academy, located inside the Laurel Mall in Hazle Township, has 30 fulltime staff members who assist approximately 1,000 students who study online. The space includes rooms for teachers to use for streaming classes online, as well as additional space for counseling or testing needs, an eSports program,

applications/keyboarding, personal financial literacy, crafts, speech and debate, journalism, world cultures, accounting, business law, web page design, painting, music theory/technology, principles of anthropology/world literature, historical and theoretical concepts in music, art history, modern theater production, American dance history, business principles and management, music appreciation, registration that's centrally located in the community, and a school spirit store.

The district operates a newcomer center for children from kindergarten through sixth grade who have been in the United States for less than one year inside the Hazle Township Early Learning Center building on 23rd Street. At the center, students concentrate on English while learning other subjects. After a year, most will pass to other schools. Staff members include translators, a bilingual administrator and paraprofessionals.

Hazleton Area provides Early Intervention resources through the Luzerne/Wyoming Counties Early Intervention Program and prekindergarten classes at the Hazleton Area Academy building at Pardee and 10th streets in Hazleton. The Early Intervention program is a year-round, comprehensive and collaborative system that optimizes children's development, supports the family's responsibility and enhances their capacity to care for their child. Eligible young children receive a variety of need-based services in the least restrictive environment, which may include the home, preschool, Head Start, a specialized class or a combination of these.

Early Intervention Services range from direct to consultative in nature. Related services to children include support in the areas of speech, hearing, vision and behavior along with assistance with psychological evaluations and assistive technology. Services are

provided when the Individualized Education Program (IEP) team determines the child has a specific need for the respective services. These services are available to children ages 3 to beginners who meet the eligibility criteria of a 25% delay in one or more of the five developmental areas.

The academy building also contains Vital House, where students will learn to live independently, the district's Technology Department and a warehouse.

Hazleton Area students don't just excel academically, they also produce standout results athletically in more than 15 sports during the fall, winter and spring sports seasons. The Cougars and Lady Cougars field teams in football, baseball, basketball, softball, cross country, track and field, swimming, water polo, soccer, tennis, volleyball, lacrosse, bowling and cheerleading. There are freshmen football, basketball and baseball teams and junior high sports are offered in cross country, football, field hockey, soccer, volleyball, basketball, cheerleading, wrestling, track and field and softball.



Hazleton Area High School educates approximately 3,700 students in grades 9-12.

Keystone Job Corps offers education and job training

The Keystone Job Corps Center in Drums provides low-income individuals ages 16-24 with free career training so they can gain the skills and tools they need to be successful. At Job Corps, students can find a supportive community to lean on, earn a high school diploma or equivalent, and take their training and education and put them into action.

Students receive hands-on advanced career training and classes in academic subjects like reading and math. Training is offered in the following areas: bricklayer pre-apprentice, carpentry preapprentice, and security and protective services.



Greater Hazleton's history began with coal and today it is a center for manufacturing

From its coal-mining glory days to its place in the forefront of both the development and widespread usage of electric lighting and cable television, Greater Hazleton's past is rich with history-making technological advances.

By piecing together the events that molded modern-day Greater Hazleton you get a true sense of this place we call home. So much of our rich past involves the discovery and mining of anthracite coal, but it's the spirit of today's descendants of coal miners that has us on a course for amazing prosperity.

The Area's First Settlers

Before our European ancestors carved out their

settlements, tribes of Native Americans flourished. Members of the Iroquois, Lenni Lenape and Delaware tribes cut dozens of well-worn paths between the Lehigh and Susquehanna rivers. These routes were valuable for trade and control of them was hotly contested during early colonial times.

At the height of the American War of Independence, a company of Minutemen marched along such a path that meandered from Monroe County to the Wyoming Valley. Well-armed British Tories and Indians surprised the Minutemen as they rested at the base of Buck Mountain in Conyngham Valley. Ironically, it was this death and destruction along the Little Nescopeck Creek that breathed life into the area now known as Greater Hazleton.

Many historians believe the first permanent settlers of Hazleton were sent to bury the fallen victims of this infamous Sugarloaf Massacre of 1780. Some of the soldiers settled in St. Johns, while others built homes along a "warrior's path" that roughly followed the present-day Broad Street in Downtown Hazleton.

While our roots are stained red, it's the black of coal that has long forged this region and tempered its mindset of achievement and growth. In 1750, a gunsmith 45 miles southeast in Nazareth received hard black coal stones in trade with an Indian from the Northeast. And just up the road in Wilkes-Barre, Obadiah and Daniel Gore burned coal in their forge as early as 1770. The search for the richest veins of coal continued for more than 150 years.

In 1791, a hunter named Philip Ginter stumbled upon coal stones in the area now called Summit Hill. Ginter understood the significance of his find 14 miles outside Hazleton; he put aside his hunting rifle and built the Lehigh Coal and Navigation Co.

The Beginnings of a Community

In 1804, about the same time Lewis and Clark set out on their famous westward expedition, the first major road connecting our region to larger population centers was established. The Berwick Turnpike -- today's Route 93 -- was cut along an old trail that wound through the heart of our area. At that time, most of the "city" remained a dense pine forest with thickets of hazel. The settlement was little more than a tollgate along the turnpike.

The turnpike blossomed into a valuable crossroads for trade. But it was logging, not coal, that became the first profitable operation in the valley. By 1810, lumber was carried by horses or oxen down the Berwick Turnpike to the Lehigh and Schuylkill rivers. From there, it floated its way south to market.

Hazleton's first tavern and hotel, The State House, was built at the corner of today's Broad and Vine streets. The State House was an oasis of shelter for the missionaries and soldiers who passed through the wilderness on the road from Wilkes-Barre.

Coal Becomes the Region's Calling Card

The War of 1812 stoked the young nation's demand for coal. After all, real political and economic independence

from Britain would only happen when the colonies weaned themselves from the cheap coal they had been importing from England. This cause lit the fuse for domestic mining operations to explode upon the scene.

Greater Hazleton happened to be sitting on some of the deepest and purest veins of black gold. Railroad developers became interested in the area once the rumors of a coal discovery in nearby Beaver Meadows were validated.

A young New Yorker named Arivistius "Ario" Pardee was hired to survey the area and to report the practicality of extending a railroad from Mauch Chunk (now Jim Thorpe) to Beaver Meadows. Seizing the moment, Pardee bought up land in present-day Hazleton. The investment proved extraordinarily lucrative thanks to a massive anthracite coal field. Historians have tabbed Pardee the founding father of Hazleton.

Pardee incorporated the Hazleton Coal Company in 1836. The coal baron then built the first school on Church Street (where Hazleton City Hall now sits) and the city's first church, First Presbyterian Church, located at Church and Broad Streets. The Pardee Mansion was built on the north side of Broad Street, between Church and Laurel streets.

As these other institutions began to take root, Pardee opened several mines that straddled Hazleton's mammoth vein of coal. The budding coal industry attracted a flood of immigrants. The Germans and Irish came first in the 1840s and '50s. The next wave – from 1860-1920 – included throngs of Italians, Polish, Russians, Lithuanians and Slovaks.

66 – History

Skilled labor became increasingly important. Pardee made significant contributions to the engineering and geology programs at Lafayette College in Easton. His patronage also extended to a number of other organizations, and he mentored the next generation of community leaders.

George Markle was one of Pardee's most inspiring success stories. Markle was born into a poor family and his expertise in mechanical engineering was largely selflearned. At the age of 14, he was sent to Philadelphia to work in a carpentry shop. An injury forced him to return home, where he learned to make saddles with his father. At 20, he went to work at a foundry.

The varied experience paid off. The newly married Markle started as a clerk in Pardee's company store at Hazleton was incorporated as a borough on January 5, 1857. Its name was supposed to be spelled "Hazelton" but a clerk misspelled it on papers used during incorporation. It's been Hazleton ever since.

The area's first newspaper, the Hazleton Sentinel, was founded in 1866, the year after the Civil War ended. The borough's first fire company, the Pioneer Fire Company, was organized in 1867 by soldiers returning from the Civil War.

With its population soaring to some 14,000, Hazleton was incorporated as a city on December 4, 1891.

At the Forefront

Because of the wealth brought by coal and its related industries, Greater Hazleton was one of the first regions of the nation to enjoy many of the exciting and innovative

> technological breakthroughs of the late 1800s and early 1900s.

Hazleton became the third city in the world to install electric streetlights – and Thomas A. Edison himself personally signed the contract for the lights! The Edison Electric Illuminating Co. of Hazleton was organized during a meeting at the YMCA on October 15, 1883. A generating plant was constructed at

Broad and Wyoming streets. At age 22, Markle had advanced to hold the positions of bookkeeper and superintendent for Pardee's booming coal business. Before long, he was named general superintendent of all of Pardee's collieries.

Markle made his mark by improving almost every technical aspect of mining operations. The modern coal breaker was invented

by Markle, as was a new pump to keep mines dry and save lives during floods.

Pardee and Markle were true barons of the coal industry. They believed an individual with wealth had an obligation to serve as "a trustee for his fellow man."

Greater Hazleton Fuels the Industrial Age

The coal mined here in Greater Hazleton helped establish America as a world industrial power. Hard anthracite coal burns cleaner, longer and hotter than the softer bituminous coal found in other parts of the country – and that made it extremely desirable for industry. For nearly a century, coal was shipped in ever-increasing amounts from the Hazleton area to locations all over the world.

Hazleton is Born

Wyoming and Green streets and the lights went on inside the plant the following January. During the next few months, incandescent lights flickered on all over town.

In 1888, Hazleton received one of the earliest telephone exchanges. Before the turn of the century, the city laid claim to a trolley car system, glamorous theaters, a number of specialty stores, beautiful parks and a thriving industrial base. The majestic buildings anchoring the downtown business community date back to this golden era of the early 20th century.

Shifting Towards the New Economy

With the sudden availability of alternate heating fuels, demand for coal dropped in the 1920s and '30s. Some local businesses never fully recovered from the years of rationing made necessary during World War I. The Stock Market Crash of '29 affected the whole nation with rampant bankruptcy and unemployment.

By the '50s, the coal mines and related industries were hurting. The U.S. economy was almost entirely powered by other fuels. Luckily, a group of forwardthinking businessmen came up with a novel plan to ensure a productive future for their treasured home.

Their innovative plan: To create an economic development organization like none other and lure new



Cyril and Methodius Parish at St. Joseph's Church, Most Precious Blood, Annunciation Parish at St. Gabriel's Church, Queen of Heaven Parish at Our Lady of Grace Church and Holy Rosary Church, all located in Hazleton; Holy Name of Jesus Parish at Transfiguration Church in West Hazleton; Good Shepherd Church in Drums; St. John Bosco Church in Conyngham and Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception in Freeland.

Many of these churches date back to the mid- to late-1800s. The former St. Gabriel's Church was founded in the 1850s when Bishop John Neumann (who was canonized as a Saint in 1977) met with Father Michael Scanlon and a committee of others to discuss building a church in Hazleton. The original St. Gabriel's Church was completed in 1856 and a new one was erected in 1869 after the congregation outgrew the first church.

St. Joseph's Church was organized more than 140 years ago in 1882 by the Rev. Ignatius Jaskovic, marking it as the oldest Slovak Roman Catholic Parish in the Western Hemisphere. Most Precious Blood Church began in 1888 when Rev. Nasca was appointed the first pastor and

started to draw up plans for a small church for the growing amount of immigrants that had congregated in the area. The congregation raised money to purchase three lots on what is now Fourth and Seybert streets and built a modest church that was consecrated to the Most Precious Blood of our Divine Savior.

Good Shepherd began when Father

Francis A. Costello was instructed by Bishop Hafey in March of 1940 to start a parish to provide pastoral care of Catholics in Butler, Sugarloaf and Dennison townships and Conyngham borough. On Sunday, March 31, 1940, Fr. Costello celebrated the first Mass in the building that used to be the Green Gables Club. Bishop Hafey formally blessed Good Shepherd Church on Sunday, May 12, 1940. When the Catholic population of the Conyngham and Sugarloaf valleys became too large, families petitioned Bishop Jerome D. Hannan to construct a new church for them. After meticulous planning, construction began early in 1963 and on December 15, 1963, St. John Bosco Church was dedicated.

Greater Hazleton's Lutheran churches date back to the late 1700s. St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church got its foundation in the 1790s. At the time, Lutheran and Reformed ministers visited this area and held services in private homes and provided some sort of itinerant

ministry. A Reformed Church organized first in the fall of 1792 and, just seven years later, the growing Lutheran

community met and organized their church, the day after Christmas, 1799. In 1800, both congregations met and decided to build a union church. By building one "union" church, two denominations could more readily afford its upkeep. They held their first services in the church in 1808.

The cornerstone for Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church in Hazleton was laid in 1862 by the Rev. R.S. Wagner. Church members originally belonged to the first German church in Hazleton but had a great need to identify as Lutheran, so they broke away to form their own. The congregation spent its early years working to transform into an English-speaking church to assimilate itself into the community. Its goal was to show a commitment to Christian education for everyone in the congregation.

also operates its own school for children in pre-school and kindergarten. Other Lutheran/Evangelical churches

> include West Hazleton Trinity Lutheran Church, Salem Lutheran Church and Iglesia Buenas Nuevas/ Good News Church.

Area Methodist churches include Diamond United Methodist Church, Saint John's Primitive Methodist Church, Saint Paul's Methodist Church and Weatherly Centenary. The Methodist religion became prevalent in Greater Hazleton in the 1830s when Hazleton became a stop on a minister's traveling route as part of the old Baltimore Conference. When the minister came to Hazleton, he would deliver his sermon on the grounds of what is today City Hall. The group of community members that grew from these masses became the original congregation of St. Paul's Methodist Church. As Hazleton expanded over the next several decades, a portion of the city became known as the "Diamond Addition." The Methodist residents of this area eventually decided to form their own church. After renting space around town for several years, Diamond United Methodist Church was built

Today, many local churches meet in a variety of venues, from traditional facilities to former storefronts. Some congregations have moved into buildings originally constructed for other churches, ushering in a new era of religion in Greater Hazleton. One of those, Maranatha Seventh-Day Adventist Romanian & Multinational Church, offers translation into French, Romanian, Russian, Serbian and Spanish. Valley Community Church meets in a storefront in the Rittenhouse Place in Drums.

Area non-denominational churches include Faith United Church of Christ, Faith Assembly of God Church and LCBC Church.

Greater Hazleton's nondenominational churches provide area residents with access to services that are focused on uniting the community in a joyous and peaceful celebration of divine faith and values designed for people to build relationships with one another.

Latino congregations have also reclaimed dormant church buildings, conducting services in Spanish or in both English and Spanish. Jewish congregations meet at Temple Beth Israel and Agudas Israel Synagogue, while Jehovah's Witnesses gather at their Kingdom Hall on the Arthur Gardner Parkway.

Members of the religious community in Greater Hazleton are known for putting their faith in action. Several churches deliver meals to the homebound, serve meals to the homeless at local soup kitchens or collect items for local food pantries.

The Salvation Army of Hazleton, Catholic Social Services of Hazleton, United Charities and CEO Hazleton serve lunch during the week.

At Christmas, Holy Rosary Church holds a Christmas Community Dinner sponsored by the Greater Hazleton Ministerial Association and the United Way of Greater Hazleton. The Greater Hazleton Ministerial Association also joins the Hazleton Jewish Community Council to co-sponsor the annual Israel T. and Mildred Klapper Memorial Holocaust Essay Contest for high school students.

Summer festivals are a staple of several Hazleton area churches. Some of the most popular ones are the Feast of St. Mauro at Queen of Heaven Parish, Most Precious Blood Church's Madonna Del Monte procession, and festivals at Holy Annunciation, Holy Rosary, Holy Name of Jesus and Good Shepherd.


set design and management for its performances.

Hazleton Art League provides a variety of opportunities for artists of all ages

The Hazleton Art League is a thriving creative space where Greater Hazleton's arts and cultural community can participate, educate, and celebrate in the power of unique individual expression. The gallery is free and open to the public Tuesday through Sunday.

For more than 75 years, the organization has been providing adult

and youth artists throughout the area a variety of instructional classes, including drawing, painting, photography, stained glass,

fused glass, jewelry making, pottery, ceramics, and pysanky art. Art instruction is available throughout the year through the art league's winter, spring and summer programs. Children ages 6-14 can also attend the annual Summer Art Camp, an eightweek program that offers full-day and half-day art class sessions.

The Hazleton Art League is located inside the Hayden Family Center for the Arts near the corner of Broad and Laurel streets in the heart of downtown Hazleton. The facility includes a main gallery for artist exhibitions and musical performances,

that is home to the Hazleton Kitchen Incubator program. The organization often rents out the facility to individuals, businesses and organizations throughout the area that are hosting private parties and meetings.

The Art League is always looking for new and exciting things to provide for both its members and the Greater Hazleton community. It's focused on being a welcoming place for diverse artists of all ages, genders and nationalities.

Many well-known artists have displayed their work at the Hazleton Art League, including Judith Joy Ross who has had major exhibitions in Philadelphia and several parts of Europe. Artists from around the area, including international artists who have ties to Greater Hazleton and some who live in other states, have also shown their work at the gallery.

The Art League hosts many special events throughout the year, including its Member Show, Art Youth Expo and Peace Love Chalk festival. The Member Show is held every March and features the talented artists who are among its membership. Art Youth Expo is held in June and celebrates young artists ages 13-30. These artists exhibit their work and compete in the Youth (13-17) and Adult (18-30) categories. The two-day event features many activities

> including an art festival, art contest with cash prizes, open mic night, fashion show, collaborative art projects, live art battle, and live music. The Peace Love Chalk festival, which is sponsored by Joe Maddon's Respect 90 Foundation, is held in September and features a chalk art competition. During the festival, artists grab their paper and chalk and create artwork in the moment.

In addition to its own events, the Hazleton Art League also partners with other art galleries and organizations for events, such as when they had a joint exhibition with the Wyoming Valley Art League at Luzerne County Community College's Schulman Gallery.

> The Hazleton Art League believes in supporting artists of all levels and experiences. Artists who are looking to make a name for themselves can exhibit their artwork in the gallery, become a featured artist and sell their work through the art league's website, or become a teaching artist for classes and workshops.

Area theater groups offer variety of shows

Greater Hazleton is home to several theater groups that give children and adults with a love for plays and musical theater a chance to shine on the big stage.

Drama in Motion (DM) Performance Works is a theater company based out of Nuremberg that's dedicated to bringing quality shows to the area. The theater group puts on a variety of shows that appeal to audiences of all ages. The organization offers scholarships to those in financial need for lessons in all facets of the performing arts, and also offers a learning theater environment for its Performance Works Youth Academy members.

Through its Summer Theater Camp, students enjoy a week of theater fun filled with games, lessons and dance that culminates in a full-scale youth production –

including costumes and lighting – at the end of the week. The camp is designed to help young performers prepare for mainstage and junior productions. The MPB Community Players welcome performers of all ages who love to sing, dance and act. Since 1988, this community theater group has presented a variety of well-known musicals and

> productions, as well as an annual Christmas concert.

The MPB Players have also been partnering with members of the Hazleton Integration Project for community shows and a Children's Theatre Workshop. The beginnerfriendly workshop is designed to help children ages 7-12 learn the basics of theater, including establishing a stage presence, singing in a group and using a script.

For the past 70 years, the Hazleton Philharmonic Symphony Orchestra has been delighting audiences with its lush orchestral performances at venues across Greater Hazleton. The group's 50 members play a variety of instruments,

including violins, violas, cellos and string bass.

Historical societies preserve area's past

Residents and visitors alike can take a trip back in time by visiting the Greater Hazleton Historical Society on Wyoming Street in Hazleton and the Conyngham Valley Historical Society on Main Street in Conyngham.

Founded in 1980, the Greater Hazleton Historical Society & Museum has been dedicated to advocating and preserving the rich cultural, industrial, and architectural heritage of the City of Hazleton and its surrounding communities. It has focused much of its efforts on preserving Greater Hazleton's unique architecture, revitalizing Hazleton's downtown and residential neighborhoods, and interpreting the region's cultural past.

The Historical Society's three-story museum has its own rich history. It's located at the site of the former Borough Hall (later Hazleton's first City Hall until the completion of the present City heritage by developing a historic preservation strategy to preserve the architectural character of the storied Church Street residential neighborhood near Downtown Hazleton.

The Valley towns just outside Hazleton also have their own rich cultural history. Visitors to the Conyngham Valley Historical Society (CVHS) can take a look back at the founding of the Conyngham Valley and its surrounding area, which dates back to 1769.

CVHS' museum features dozens of exhibits and artifacts from throughout Conyngham's history, including photographs, outfits, farming and household equipment, military memorabilia and books. The CVHS was founded following the celebration of the 100th anniversary of Conyngham's incorporation as a borough. Interest in the area's history was so profound that the town's residents expressed a desire to form a Historical Committee to further study

the area's rich history.

Today, history lovers can visit the CVHS Museum, which is housed in the former Independent Order of Odd Fellows (IOOF) building, every Saturday from 1-4 p.m. CVHS also hosts many annual events both at the museum and throughout Conyngham, including a Mother's Day Tea, Concert in the Park series,

Veteran's Day program and Holiday House Tour.

Hazleton Area Public Library serves its communities from five locations

The Hazleton Area Public Library strives to inform, enlighten and entertain all people living in Greater Hazleton by providing access to books, programs and materials that foster community spirit, learning and growth. The library operates a main branch on Church Street right across from Hazleton City Hall, as well as satellite branches in Freeland, Nuremberg, McAdoo and Conyngham.

The library is not only a place to get your favorite books, in fact, today's library is about much more than just books; it offers public computers and free Wi-Fi, videos, mobile printing and much more.

Any resident of the Hazleton Area School District or Luzerne County is eligible for a library card at no charge. Library card members have access to a variety of services, including the use of public computers at the library's locations.

In addition to its vast collection of books, the Hazleton Public Library accepts requests for books and periodical articles that the library doesn't own through its interlibrary loan program.

The library also provides many ways for young children to get engaged in reading and learning, especially through its Storytime program for toddlers (ages 2-3) and Preschool children (ages 4-5). Storytimes are thematic programs filled with stories, songs, activities and crafts designed to foster a love of books and reading.

The Hazleton Public Library hosts a variety of special events and activities throughout the year, including a Summer Reading Club and Storytime in the Park series.

Every summer, Ferrwood Music Camp hosts a two-week camp dedicated to providing children in grades 5-12 with a quality music program that is affordable and family friendly. The camp focuses on teaching young beginners who want to learn how to play a concert band instrument or sing with a chorus. At the end of their camp experience, the students perform a free concert that is open to the public. Father Jospeh Ferrara started the Ferrwood Music Camp in 1969 as a compliment to his Hazleton Philharmonic adult orchestra. The site where the camp resides was originally founded in 1927 as the Luzerne County Fresh Air Camp for children predisposed to tuberculosis and was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 2017.

Many outdoor options for all ages

Greater Hazleton is the perfect place to be for athletes of all ages, thrill-seekers and those who love to watch great sporting action.

Whether you enjoy golfing, children's sporting events, running, auto racing, skydiving or whitewater rafting, there is something for everyone in the region.

Golfers can hit the links at one of several pristine 18-hole golf courses in the area, including Sugarloaf, Sand Springs, Split Rock, and Blue Ridge Trail. There are also several miniature golf courses in the area that provide fun for the whole family.

There is an active network of youth sports leagues throughout the area that provide divisions for children of all ages. This includes baseball, softball, basketball and soccer leagues as well as cheerleading. There are also many youth sports camps for children who want to stay active in the summer.

Runners of all ages can take part in a variety of runs, walks and fun runs throughout the year. The Valley Running Club hosts a Festival of Races series that features several signature annual events. The club also routinely promotes many charity runs and walks that are being held in the area.

If you are into auto racing action, Greater Hazleton is less

Greater Hazleton and the region offer many year-round recreational opportunities

Although Hazleton is known for being a bustling city and active business district, there are ample opportunities throughout the area to find green space and enjoy the great outdoors.

The City of Hazleton's Parks and Recreation Department operates and maintains 16 parks in the city and provides recreation and event programming to participants of all ages and abilities. These parks are maintained to provide residents and visitors with a way to explore the natural world that helps contribute to their overall wellness and prosperity.

The crown jewel of Hazleton's park system is City View Park. The 17.5-acre park, located at 700 South Poplar Street, includes a stage with a dance area, five lighted pavilions, a paved walking path, picnic areas, bathrooms, ample parking and a members-only dog park called Bailey's Bark Park. City View Park is the year-round gathering spot for a host of exciting events and activities, including the City of Hazleton's New Year's Eve and Independence Day Fireworks celebrations, Easter Bunny Trail, Halloween Trail of Treats and Winterfest with Santa Claus Parade.

City View Park Playground, Altmiller Park Playground, and Arthur Street Playground all have inclusive playground equipment for those with special needs. Additionally, the City of Hazleton recently invested millions into upgrading many of the parks and now offers places for Wiffle ball and pickleball lovers.

St. Stanislaus Park, located at East 17th and Hayes streets, is home to six new pickleball courts that can be rented out by the hour. Since they were installed, these courts have been consistently packed with pickleball players throughout the day. At Roosevelt Park, located near 17th and McKinley streets, a Wiffle ball field with artificial turf was recently added, along with places to play cornhole and horseshoes. Additional amenities at the City of Hazleton's parks include basketball and tennis courts; baseball and softball fields; skate ramps; a hockey rink; chess tables; picnic areas; walking paths and plenty of grassy areas to play.

All parks/playgrounds are open from dawn to dusk and can be rented for parties and other special occasions. Rental applications for the parks and a Bailey's Bark Park membership application can be found under the Recreation section on the City of Hazleton's website.

Not far from City View Park is Greater Hazleton's other recreational treasure, the Greater Hazleton Rails to Trails. This 5.6-mile stretch of land is maintained by the Chamber's affiliate, the Greater Hazleton Area Civic Partnership. It's the perfect place for hiking, biking, cross-country skiing and exploring nature.

In addition to its natural beauty and recreational benefits, the trail features five permanent exercise stations along the first mile as well as a Story Walk with 16 stations that feature a page from a rotating storybook that is maintained by the Hazleton Area Public Library. There is also a scenic overlook, pavilion with picnic tables and dog watering station along the trail at the end of the Dreck Creek Reservoir.

Area community parks offer many activities including sports, hiking, biking and more

One of the many benefits of living in Greater Hazleton is the access to nature through community parks no matter where you are in the area.

These parks offer year-round outdoor recreational opportunities for people of all ages, including hiking, biking, skiing, fishing and

more than 40 different kinds of plants and trees that was created by the Hazleton Garden Club.

Drums, Conyngham, McAdoo and Freeland all have their own community parks. Drums is home to both Freedom Park and Butler Township Community Park. Freedom Park is located on Butler

boating activities. The parks are also a great place for children to have fun on the playground or engage in an exciting game of baseball, basketball, softball or soccer.

CAN DO Community Park is located right in the center of Downtown Hazleton at the intersection of Broad and Laurel streets. The park, which is maintained by CAN DO and the CAN DO Community Foundation, features a paved plaza, walkways, a small lawn area, pedestrian lighting, and benches. The park is a gathering place for the public for many activities and events

throughout the year, including First Friday celebrations and the annual CAN DO Community Park Tree Lighting ceremony.

Hazle Township is home to two parks – Hazle Township Community Park, located just off the Airport Beltway, and Inspiration Park, located at the corner of 23rd and Laurel streets. Lake Irena at Hazle Township Community Park is a popular fishing and hiking destination. The park also includes picnic areas, sports fields, playgrounds, walking trails and a band shell-like pavilion for outdoor performances.

Inspiration Park is the site of a beautiful gazebo and a garden with

George E. Ernst Pool and John and Ruth Gould Recreation Center, which are both maintained by the Conyngham Valley Civic Organization. The park is home to the Valley West Little League and Babe Ruth complex and also features basketball courts, tennis courts, an open gathering space that is used for public and private events throughout the year, and Ryanne's Playground.

Freeland Public Park is adjacent to the Freeland YMCA on Front Street. It features walking paths, playground equipment, basketball courts, outdoor covered picnic areas, an indoor pavilion for parties and events, and military memorial monuments.

Rails to Trails a great place to hike, bike and cross-country ski

The Greater Hazleton Rails to Trails is one of the area's greatest recreational treasures. This 5.6-mile stretch of land is maintained by the Chamber's affiliate, the Greater Hazleton Area Civic Partnership. It's the perfect place for hiking, biking, cross-country skiing and exploring nature.

Rails to Trails is located on the site of the former Delaware, Susquehanna and Schuylkill rail line that supported the local coal mining industry. The trail currently runs from its starting point at the intersection of State Routes 93 and 424 in the southeastern corner of Hazleton to an area near Hazlebrook. The next planned extension will stretch the trail to Eckley Miners' Village. The goal is to one day have a full 16.4-mile trail that serves as a critical connection in the Delaware Lehigh (D&L) National Heritage Corridor Trail system.



Rails to Trails also has five permanent exercise stations and a Story Walk with 16 stations that feature a page from a rotating storybook that is maintained by the Hazleton Area Public Library.

Drive near the Butler Township Community Center. The complex features baseball, softball and Babe Ruth fields that are used by the Valley East teams, as well as a basketball court and playground equipment.

Butler Township Community Park features walking trails, baseball and soccer fields, a basketball court, a skate park, playground equipment and an outdoor pavilion for picnics and parties.

Conyngham's Whispering Willows Park is located just off of Main Street in the heart of the town. It's near the

Cool off at a water park, fly down a ski slope, take in some family fun at an amusement park and check out Little League and Minor League baseball, Minor League hockey, horse racing or professional auto racing action all within less than a two-hour drive from Greater Hazleton.

Those who love to celebrate summer by vising an amusement park can check out Knoebels Amusement Resort in Elysburg, Hersheypark in Hershey and Dorney Park & Wildwater Kingdom in Allentown. All three feature rides for the whole family and each one has a separate water park.

Knoebels has more than 60 rides and attractions for the whole family to enjoy, including the Phoenix roller coaster and Grand Carousel. The park is famous for its free parking and free admission. Hersheypark, the largest amusement park in Pennsylvania, includes 15 thrilling roller coasters and offers year-round activities and events, including the 11-acre ZooAmerica zoo and the famous Hershey's Chocolate World experience. Dorney Park & Wildwater Kingdom offers more than 60 world-class rides, one of the northeast's largest waterparks, live entertainment, thrills for children at Planet Snoopy, and amusement park-favorite foods including a buildyour-own funnel cake bar.

You can also find some water park fun at H2Oooohh Indoor Water Park at Split Rock Resort in Lake Harmony, Camelbeach Mountain Water Park in Tannersville, Montage Mountain Water Park near Scranton, Great Wolf Lodge in Scotrun and Kalahari Indoor Water Park in Pocono Manor.

Kalahari features 22,000 square feet of wet and wild fun for the whole family. It includes multiple water slides, a play area, a place to test your bodyboarding or surfing skills on a five-foot wave simulator, and indoor and outdoor spas. Camelbeach Mountain Water Park

has 37 water rides and slides for all ages, an interactive area for toddlers and 170,000 square feet of indoor games.

Northeast PA is a ski-lovers paradise! Winter weather enthusiasts can enjoy skiing, snowboarding and snow tubing action at places like Jack Frost Big Boulder, Montage Mountain Resorts, Camelback Mountain Resort, Blue Mountain Resort, Elk Mountain Ski Resort, Shawnee Mountain Ski Area and Alpine Mountain Ski Area.

Jack Frost Big Boulder Ski Resort in White Haven features 38 trails, including 10 Easy trails and 15 Most Difficult trails so that there is something for beginners and

the more experienced skier. Montage Mountain Ski Resort near Scranton has 27 trails that cover 140 acres. It offers beginner terrain and some of the best expert slopes in Pennsylvania.

Baseball lovers can enjoy a day at the ballpark watching Triple A action with the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders in Moosic and the Lehigh Valley IronPigs in Allentown, or Single A baseball games with the Reading Phillies in Reading. Hockey fans will find plenty of action when they check out the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins, a minor league affiliate of the Pittsburgh Penguins, at Mohegan Sun Arena at Casey Plaza in Wilkes-Barre.



Pocono International Raceway is less than 45 minutes away from Hazleton.

Auto racing fans are in for a treat at Pocono International Raceway in Long Pond, which is known nationally as the Tricky Triangle. The raceway hosts an entire weekend of action every July that culminates with the Pocono 400 NASCAR Cup Series race. The action also

includes NASCAR CRAFTSMAN Truck Series, NASCAR Xfinity Series and ARCA Menards Series events.

Wilkes-Barre's The Downs at Mohegan Pennsylvania offers the most thrilling live harness racing action from March through November. The Mohegan Pennsylvania casino features slot machines and game tables, restaurants, stores, entertainment, and a hotel and convention center.

Northeast PA receives international attention each year when the Little League World Series is held in Williamsport. More than 400,000 baseball fans visit the area to check out the tournament and cheer on their favorite team. The Little League World Series features 16 teams of players ages 10-12 from around the world

who compete in 32 games over the course of 10 days for the chance to be named World Series Champion.

Eckley Miners' Village preserved as patch town

Greater Hazleton has a rich arts and cultural history but what the region is most well-known for is the role it played at the epicenter of anthracite coal mining in the mid-1800s. That's what makes Eckley Miners' Village, which has been preserved to still depict much of what life was like then, such a cultural treasure for the region.

Eckley Miners' Village was founded in 1854 and named after Eckley B. Coxe, who was one of the area's most prominent coal barons. Some of the original partners, Sharpe, Weiss, Leisenring and Foster, ran the colliery until the Coxe Brothers, heirs to the original estate, assumed ownership. The village is located just outside Hazleton in Weatherly on a mountain perch that's at the center of the planet's largest concentration of anthracite coal.

The hundreds of people who visit Eckley Miners' Village each year get to experience what an authentic 19th-century company mining town looked like and learn about the working-class families who lived there.

Eckley Miners' Village, which is administered by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, engages diverse audiences by preserving and telling the story of anthracite coal mining, the social and physical history of patch towns and their residents, and the evolution of regional culture. Mining companies built these "patch town" communities to keep their employees in close proximity to the collieries where they worked and also as a way to attract other mining families to live and work among the area's coal fields. By owning the village, the company had greater control over the lives of its workers. The village's stores, schools and churches served the economic, educational and religious needs of the villagers.

Eckley, which is spread across 90 acres, is the only historical site and museum dedicated to the daily lives of immigrant miners, their families, and their descendants. There are more than 100 buildings on the property, including a visitor center, historic miner homes and cottages, the owners' mansions, several churches, a social and sports club, the foundations of a hotel, the site of the company store, a breaker, mule barns, and the ornate Sharpe House.

Many people visit Eckley Miners' Village each year to attend their popular Patch Town Days, Halloween event and Christmas at Eckley celebrations. Patch Town Days is held annually in June and features a day of music, crafts, special presentations and anthracite heritage. Christmas at Eckley is a family-friendly event that offers activities and events for all ages. In addition to touring the historic buildings, visitors can view a Ukrainian Christmas Eve display and meet St. Nick.

Greater Hazleton region is close to nearly 20 state parks

Greater Hazleton residents and visitors are fortunate to have access to some of the most beautiful state parks and recreation areas in the

country. There are nearly 20 state parks, three state forests and one national recreation area near the region.

Nescopeck State Park in Drums is a 3,550-acre site that includes wetlands, rich forests and diverse habitats. The Nescopeck Creek winds its way through the park and is a big attraction for those looking for some great fishing action. There are also numerous hiking trails that allow people to really explore the vast natural beauty of the park.

The park is also home to an environmental education center that offers year-round educational programs for local schools and recreational programs for park visitors.

General park visitors can learn through programs that focus on the natural, historical, and cultural features of the park and region.

Hickory Run State Park in White Haven includes more than 40 miles of hiking trails, three state park natural areas and miles of trout streams across nearly 16,000 acres of land. The striking boulder-strewn area called Boulder Field is a National Natural Landmark. Boulder Field, which includes some rocks that are 26

feet long, dates back more than 20,000 years.

There are two lakes at the park: the smaller Hickory Run Lake near

Boulder Field and the larger Sand Spring Lake, where people can swim within a designated area. There are also several natural and man-made waterfalls throughout the park including Hawk Falls, a 25-foot natural waterfall.

The park is also useful in the winter for hiking, sledding, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, ice skating and snowmobiling.

Lehigh Gorge State Park in White Haven is a 6,107-acre park that follows

the Lehigh River from Francis E. Walter Dam in the north to Jim Thorpe in the south. The park is a deep gorge with steep walls that was carved out by the river and features thick vegetation, rock outcroppings and waterfalls.

The park is a favorite of people who love whitewater boating, biking, snowmobiling and fishing. Hikers enjoy walking along the Lehigh Gorge Trail, which follows more than 20 miles of the Delaware & Lehigh Trail. The Lehigh River flows for 103 miles through seven counties until it connects with the Delaware River in Easton. The 32-mile portion of the Lehigh River from the Francis E. Walter Dam to Jim Thorpe is designated as a component of the Pennsylvania Scenic Rivers System.

than an hour away from the Pocono Raceway, home to an annual NASCAR race. You can also check out Evergreen Raceway in Drums and the Weatherly Hillclimb in Weatherly. Evergreen Raceway is a 1/3 mile asphalt oval that hosts a variety of stock car and drag racing competitions every weekend from April to November

The Weatherly Hillclimb Association hosts two annual events sanctioned by the Sports Car Club of America. The mile-long course consists of uphill straights and both sweeping and hairpin turns.

Spectators can safely watch from many of the turns on the course, or wander through the pit area to look at the cars and talk to the drivers.

Above the Poconos Skydivers/PA Skydive Center offers tandem skydiving sessions, weather-permitting, from April through September at the Hazleton Municipal Airport. Participants are harnessed to a highly experienced, U.S. Parachute Association-rated, tandem skydiving instructor for a fun and educational skydiving adventure. They also offer a Student Jump training class for people who have already made tandem or military jumps and want to learn how to move on to making non-tandem skydives and become a licensed skydiver. The center is the oldest continuously running United States Parachute Association (USPA)-member skydiving center in the world.

Whitewater Challengers in White Haven brings whitewater rafting action to Greater Hazleton and the Pocono Mountains. The trips are taken along the Lehigh River Gorge and range from easy to exhilarating. They offer several types of whitewater rafting experiences for those ages four and up, as well as solo or tandem kayaking excursions.

HARP indoor complex provides access to fitness and sports training

Hazleton Area Recreation Program (HARP) gives Greater Hazleton residents access to fitness and multi-sport training all in one location. Its indoor complex at 600 South Poplar Street in Hazleton is a full-functional training gym facility that includes six batting cages and a turf field.

HARP offers a variety of fitness classes, including Zumba, kickboxing and Strong Nation; a boxing program and a youth wrestling program. It also offers youth boxing instruction.

Anyone can sign up for a monthly membership and use the gym equipment six days a week or take advantage of HARP's class passes and personal training. HARP also makes the full turf field and batting cages available for rental.

As a community-centered business, HARP also holds many in-person and online fundraising events throughout the year for individuals and community organizations. Community

The Cancer Center is located on the hospital's campus at 772 East Broad Street in Hazleton and is home to the Lehigh Valley Hospital Hematology Oncology-Hazleton practice group.

The new facility serves as one of 24 community-based satellite locations of Lehigh Valley Topper Cancer Institute, which provides state-of-the-art cancer care throughout Northeastern and Eastern Pennsylvania.

LVHN's Cancer Center offers a wide range of cancer care services, including radiation oncology capabilities and many advanced

offerings, facilities and technologies, including:

- An expanded infusion suite with private treatment rooms,
- A state-of-the-art radiation therapy program offering innovative technologies and treatments,
- Computed tomography simulation capabilities
- Stereotactic radiation therapy,
- Access to many Cancer Institute experts,
- Access to more tumor boards, and
- Expanded telemedicine services.

This new, expanded Cancer Care center also allows LVHN to offer services that were previously unavailable in Hazleton, such as treatment using a state-of-the-art linear accelerator that shoots a beam of photons that irradiates tumors from all angles but minimizes damage to surrounding tissue.

For patients who require chemotherapy, the new center has 14 infusion rooms, six more than it previously offered. There's also a telemedicine center where patients, doctors, social workers and other caregivers can talk together. Patients can also receive hematology/ medical oncology services at the Hazleton location, as well as radiation oncology services from Allentown Radiation Oncology Associates.

LVHN is also working to connect patients with clinical trials that could provide them with even more specialized care and treatment. Pharmaceutical companies and Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center are conducting more than 2,000 clinical trials.

The Cancer Institute is one of only three cancer centers in the country participating in the Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Alliance, which provides patients with additional lifesaving care options close to home.



hamber's affiliates are key partners

At the Chamber, we are able to continue our mission to make Greater Hazleton the best place to live, and play because of the assistance we receive from our four affiliate organizations: the Downtown Hazleton Alliance for Progress (DHAP), Greater Hazleton Area Civic Partnership, Leadership Hazleton and Mountain Council of Governments (MCOG).

The Downtown Hazleton Alliance for Progress works to make

Hazleton an exciting, safe and vibrant place to live, work and visit. The group consists of representatives from public and private sectors, including city government, the Chamber of Commerce, nonprofits, colleges and community groups.

DHAP is revitalizing the city by fostering business, education and entrepreneurship, as well as by supporting new restaurants, retail shops and cultural venues and through organizing a variety of community events. The organization's work is done under the guidance of Executive Director Yosara "Yoshie" Gonzalez.

Some of DHAP's recent projects have included ongoing phases of the revitalization projects for the property at 13-15 West Broad Street and CAN DO Community Park, as well as a new project to renovate the former St. Paul's United Methodist Church building.

The lower level of the property at 13-15 West Broad Street is the home of the Hazleton LaunchBox supported by Pasco L. Schiavo Esq. Phase IV of the revitalization process is focused on renovating the second floor to be used as a lab and biotechnology incubator. At CAN DO Community Park, plans for phase two include constructing a plaza area and phase three will look at adding a performance stage, among other site improvements, to the space to

enhance the site's usability. St. Paul's United Methodist Church was built in the late 1800s but has been vacant since the church closed in 2004. DHAP purchased the building and is looking to raise funds to work with a young architect and convert the space into a cultural center.

The Greater Hazleton Area Civic Partnership (GHACP) is the primary entity that is responsible for caring for and maintaining the Greater Hazleton Rails to Trails. The GHACP continues to work on expanding the trail and working to make upgrades along the trail.

The organization also awards the annual Greater Hazleton Area Civic Partnership Technical Scholarship. The scholarship awards \$4,000 per year for up to two years to a student who is pursuing technical study ranging from a certificate program of less than one year's duration to an associate or baccalaureate degree program at an accredited institution. Candidates must attend a school in the Hazleton Area School District, Immanuel Christian School, MMI Preparatory School, Marian High School or a school in the Weatherly Area School District. Adult learners residing within the

boundaries of the Hazleton Area School District are also eligible to apply. Programs of study that qualify for the scholarship include: industrial maintenance technician, manufacturing or industrial technology, information science and technology, medical technologies, nursing, engineering or engineering technology, or production technology.

Junior Leadership Hazleton is a leadership development and

community awareness program for high school juniors. The program offers students the opportunity to work with adult leaders in their community through seven day-long seminars that are held once a month from August through ALLIANCE FOR PROGRESS February. It is designed to encourage students to recognize and develop the skills needed for leadership potential.

> During their time with Junior Leadership, students plan and implement three community service projects that take place during the year. The curriculum introduces the students to community needs, opportunities, challenges, and resources. It gives them the opportunity to develop leadership, communication, and teambuilding skills, and provides them with the opportunity to interact with students from other high schools and community leaders and decision makers.

> > Students from Hazleton Area High School, Hazleton Area Academy of Sciences, Hazleton Area Career Center, Immanuel Christian School, Marian High School (Greater Hazleton residents only), MMI Preparatory

School, and Weatherly Area High School who will be juniors in the fall of the next school year are eligible to apply.

Mountain Council of Governments (MCOG) was formed to offer local government bodies a way to work together

to achieve goals and complete projects that they otherwise could not have done alone. It is comprised of members from three cities, seven townships, seven boroughs, two school districts and two authorities.


Some of MCOG's projects and accomplishments include providing a monthly forum for the discussion of common problems, offering grant writing assistance, and introducing group members to government seminars and guest speakers that will inform them of grant availability and new regional initiatives.

The group works together in an attempt to solve a variety of environmental issues and social problems, build economic relationships, address aging infrastructure, and deal with financial issues. By building on the collective strengths of municipalities, MCOG can coordinate and direct public resources and lower the costs of government by eliminating the duplication of services. Among its many other benefits, MCOG can provide a collective revenue base and help its member entities afford equipment they couldn't purchase on their own.


