Greater Hazleton Area Civic Partnership



Governor Wolf recently announced the award of 30 Million dollars for 14 projects to reclaim abandoned mine lands (AML) in 10 Pennsylvania counties. One of the projects selected by the federal Office of Surface Mining and Reclamation is the "Eckley/Hazleton Rail Trail/Hazle Creek Cleanup". DEP Acting Secretary Patrick McDonnell said the Pilot AML projects targeted "Have an economic development aspect, more funding can be leveraged and more projects completed without additional state dollars." "Making impactful investments in PA infrastructure and communities is critically important to the future economic success of the commonwealth." said DCED Sec. Dennis Davin. The Luzerne county project is multi faceted including improved & restored water quality in Hazle Creek and Black Creek Twp., reclamation of 70 acres of AML facilitating the extension of the

Greater Hazleton Rails to Trails (GHRT) to connect with the Eckley Miners Village tourist site and to eventually connect with the larger Delaware & Lehigh National Heritage Corridor, and improved opportunities for fishing , hiking and sightseeing. Bob Skulsky, Executive Director of the Greater Hazleton Area Civic Partnership (GHACP) said that at this point much is unknown about how much funding will be coming to the GHACP and the details of what it can be used for in further development of the GHRT but meetings are ongoing with representatives of DEP and DCNR to get the details of the funding.






